





As part of the Bus Connects Clongriffin scheme the NTA are seeking to CPO a recreational green field between 45 & 47 Ayrfield Drive. Just to be clear, I am not objecting to the idea of enhanced bus corridors. I am observing that there is no requirement to CPO the aforementioned recreational field to open up access to a busy dual carriageway from our quiet, safe community.

I can only assume that the NTA believe they are doing the Ayrfield area a favour. They are not. The benefits of this proposal are far, far out weighed by the negative impacts on a safe, secure community.

Firstly let me state that both my husband - who is an annual bus pass holder for 8 years - and I are regular bus users. We have no issues with our 10/11 minute walk to access the bus stop for the city centre routes. This is not considered an inconvenience, nor have I heard anyone indicate that it is. In fact our neighbours and ourselves feel happy with our access to public transport as it stands.

This happiness is not repeated when we consider the negative impacts of the proposed CPO and subsequent development on our community green space.

- We will be losing a recreational space that is used extensively and regularly, mainly by children playing but also by adults who are tending

flower arrangements there and exercising pets. This proposal removes that amenity which provides an area for exercise and enjoyment from this community. A green space that has already, twice had planning permission refused for residential homes in the last few decades. As it was consider an essential green space for the community. This green space was also used extensively during Covid lockdown times to have an outdoor area for gatherings and children's birthday parties.

- The opening up from Ayrfield Drive to a busy dual carriageway is a massive impact on the Ayrfield Drive residents and Ayrfield in general. We live in a safe, secure, quiet residential cul-de-sac. The other side of the green is a de-facto cul-de-sac due to current low volumes of traffic and no reason for through traffic. By opening up to a dual carriageway the dynamic of our area is completely changed. There will be an increase in anti-social behaviour. The opening itself will become a ratrun for criminal absconding from Gardai. We have a low crime area in Ayrfield, that is very likely to change if this additional access and escape route is granted ABP approval.
- The impact on child safety due to this proposal is one of the key elements many residents have spoken about. Not only is it an obvious escape route in the event of a child abduction, it now grants access to a dual carriageway with cars travelling a speeds that result in death if they impact a child. This area now has a lot of young families and our children are currently free to play with our front doors open, safe in the knowledge that they are in a residential area. They have grown up and become adjusted to playing in a cul-de-sac and the field in question.

Now there will be cars travelling at 60kph (if obeying the speed limit) within meters of the areas they currently play in. This is a child death waiting to happen.

The NTA think they are doing Ayrfield a favour, but you only have to look at the pros and cons as expressed by myself and our community in general to see that this proposed CPO and subsequent development should be rejected by ABP in the interests of the community it direct affects. I seek your fair assessment of this CPO proposal and respectfully request that you deny this CPO request.
