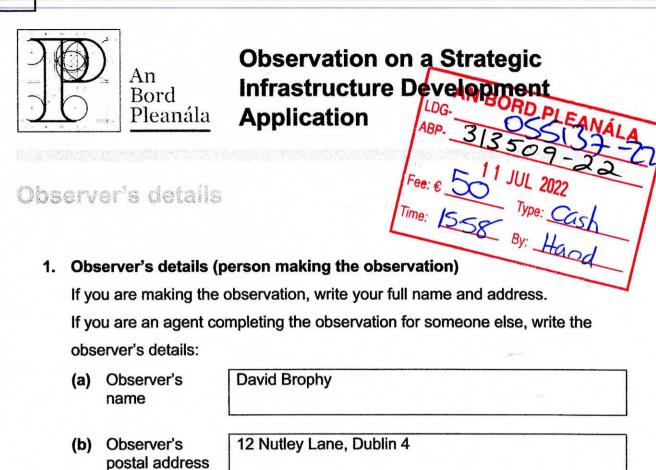

I am a home owner and resident at 12 Nutley Lane located between the Elm Park Golf Club (Elm Park) entrance and the Stillorgan Road junction. 3 of my neighbours at Nos 16, 18 and 20 Nutley Lane are supporting me on this observation.

We have viewed the National Transport Authority's (NTA) BusConnects project with dismay since its inception. The BusConnects proposal as it relates to Nutley Lane has now been submitted to An Bord Pleanala substantially in its original form, save for one material change relating to cycle lanes which had not been previously notified to the public (see final bullet point below).

Our objections to the NTA's BusConnects proposals as it relates to Nutley Lane are:

- Nowhere has a proper and cogent case been made for the conversion of a
  residential estate link road to a 4-lane highway plus 2 cycle lanes. We
  believe that the scale of the development in this residential area is
  unnecessary and that the addition of bus filter lanes at the top and bottom
  of Nutley Lane would substantially achieve the objective of speeding bus
  traffic. It seems to us that the NTA is trying to have a symmetry of 2 bus
  lanes, 2 car lanes and 2 cycle lanes wherever BusConnects is being
  introduced and we believe it is not necessary on Nutley Lane.
- The re-development of Nutley Lane as proposed will significantly degrade the local environment:
  - The "green" aspect of Nutley Lane will be seriously affected by the removal of very many mature trees. The mature hedging that separates Elm Park from Nutley Lane will also be removed and replaced with a stone wall. Visually, the Nutley area will be severely degraded by this loss of greenery.
  - The quality of the environment will also be diminished by the projected increase in traffic which will create a poorer quality of air and an increased level of noise.
- The removal of the footpath on the Elm Park side of the road will put too much pressure on the path on the opposite side of the road where it is currently difficult for 2 people to pass each other.
- The removal of many car parking spaces on Nutley Lane is likely to result in hospital visitors parking in side streets off Nutley Lane (Nutley Park, Nutley Ave, Nutley Road and Elm Park) as well as further afield on the opposite side of the Merrion Road around Sydney Parade. The additional parking planned for St Vincent's Hospital is unlikely to compensate for the

- loss of these spaces and the over-flow parking will be a nuisance for residents of the areas affected.
- The development of the 4-lane highway is likely to coincide with the construction of the new National Maternity Hospital and is likely to cause unbelievable local congestion. Allied to this are proposals to increase DART traffic on the nearby railway line which will result in more regular closure of the Merrion gates resulting in increased local congestion. Also, current proposals to amend the traffic flows on the Strand Road Sandymount will push more traffic onto the Merrion Road adding to the traffic chaos. It is obvious that a traffic management report is missing from the NTA's proposals. Its BusConnects proposal for Nutley Lane is certain to exacerbate a situation that is already expected to be difficult.
- The original BusConnects proposal that was presented to the public and on which opinions/submissions were sought envisaged the dual cycle path on Nutley Lane coming up on the Elm Park side of the road before crossing over to the opposite side after it passed the gates of Elm Park. On 12th May we were informed that an application was being made to An Bord Pleanala in relation to the Belfield/Blackrock to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Scheme and the letter outlined a number of amendments to the original proposal but without mentioning that the route of the cycle path had been changed. It is now not to cross the road but to continue straight up the Elm Park side of the road until it meets the Stillorgan Road. We consider this a very material and regressive change and cannot understand why it wasn't notified before the planning application had been made. Quite simply, the dual cycle paths now pass the front gates of 8 residential houses whereas previously, they passed the gates of only one premises on the other side (RTE's gates are now inactive). While it will make access and egress from these 8 houses more difficult (and there are constant vehicle comings and goings from these houses due to school, work, shopping trips, etc and one of the premises houses a handicapped child where it is necessary for a care vehicle to pull up outside) we consider that from a cyclist's point of view the change can only be viewed as rendering the cycle paths much more hazardous. We believe that there inevitably will be accidents with vehicles coming in and going out of these 8 houses and having to cross the cycle paths. We believe that the original proposal to have the cycle path cross to the other side of the road is the only sane one.
