

I wish to object strongly to your decision to deny an oral hearing on the Bus Corridor.

This arbitrary decision flus in the face of the principals of the Aarhus Convention. The time scale is unfair and doesn't allow adequate time for a response. The NTA refused to release any details regarding their reasoning behind the routes and now use a document dump approach to drown us with details as time runs out. An oral hearing is absolutley necessary to deal with this issue.

I also wish to restate that all forecasting models used by the NTA are out of date. Covid has permanently altered the office commuting landscape. Government legislation has granted a right to work from home. To destroy urban villages, to destroy communities, to destroy livelihoods and businesses to serve empty offices is madness. This is not just about Bus Routes, you must examine the harmful effects the proposed scheme will cause. Do not let the NTA control the narrative.

The NTA admit in their own documents that with regards Upper Baggot St werer the scheme to not go ahead there would be no negative consequences for the street. Furthermore their assertations that 6 to 12 months of digging and construction is minor... is outrageous. Not to mention the permanent damage this scheme will cause to the business and residential community of Upper Baggot St and its adjoining roads.
