



I am supportive of the overall intention of the scheme and promotion of sustainable methods of transport, however I have concerns regarding the effects on the local area.

1- The proposal of an east and west bound bus gate encloses a large number of residents in the Ceannt Fort estate, existing apartments and private dwellings along Mount Brown/Old Kilmainham. The concern is that for residents who are unable to make use of alternative transport at peak times, their journey times will have to increase causing both an inconvenience, adding to traffic already being diverted by the bus gate and unnecessarily increasing the emissions for the same journey. This would be against the principles of the Climate Action Plan 2021, disadvantages trades and large families whom are unable to transition to other modes of transport and would be against The Disability Act 2005 for less abled residents. Further to this the alternating AM/PM operation has been left open to further revision, giving no future certainty that 24hr operation of bus gates could not be implemented at a later date, further isolating residents enclosed by the gates. Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) Volume 2 of 4 Main Report Chapter 04, Section 4.6.4.3 Bus Gates states: "The hours of operation of the bus gates will be subject to on-going review based on prevailing traffic conditions and the goal of achieving the project

objectives. The NTA and local authorities will co-operate in good faith to address any issues with the hours of operation that may arise during the lifetime of the Proposed Scheme". Requests by local residents associations for the creation of a "whitelist" or passes to be made available to enclosed residents, (who do not have the option to alter their route well in advance of approaching the bus gate) has continually been rejected by the NTA. The local opinion is that the negative effect of the bus gate on residents will be substantial, whereas the traffic impact of giving locals access to the bus gate would be negligible; adequate reasoning or studies have not been put forward by the NTA to disprove this.

2- Measures have been included to respect the Thomas Street ACA including treating it with "high sensitivity" including the areas adjacent to the ACA. There is no mention of the inclusion of Ceannt Fort as an ACA, DCC draft development plan 2022-2028, nor have measures been suggested to respect its cultural and historical importance. In fact the opposite has taken place in the form of the removal of mature trees adjacent to the ACA to enable the creation of a slip road entry to the National Childrens Hospital underground car park, located at the Westbound bus gate.
