



It seems little attention has been paid to the impact on residents of the roads through which diverted traffic will travel.

The planned removal of northbound traffic on St Mobhi Road diverts traffic from Botanic Road via Glasnevin Hill, Old Finglas Road, Cremore Villas and Griffith Avenue. In addition to this, heavy traffic that currently uses Botanic Avenue and turns right northwards on to St Mobhi Road will also be forced to take this route. This does not get much consideration in the plan but the volume is significant in the afternoons/early evenings.

The route for diverted traffic now includes Marian House Nursing Home, St. Mary's Secondary school and two primary schools, St. Brigid's and Glasnevin Educate Together. Already traffic is barely tolerable and adding diverted traffic will impact very negatively on road safety, local access, air quality and general quality of life.

In addition to normal school activity, local sports clubs for hockey, basketball and soccer use the sports facilities in St. Mary's. Extra traffic will join an already chaotic system.

Living in Cremore Villas, very adjacent to two of the schools, traffic loads will be unacceptable. In the feasibility study for the bus corridor it was stated that in Cremore Villas residents generally have parking within property boundaries. This only applies to the west side of Cremore Villas; residents on the east side (including this household) park on the road.

5. Grounds

It is accepted that improved public transport is essential and the Bus Connects system attempts to address this. However, there may be other solutions to the knock on effect on surrounding roads. For example:

- Have a one way traffic system on St. Mobhi Road which reverses at peak periods i.e. one way southbound in the morning and one way northbound in the afternoon/evening. This would carry the bulk of the traffic with less impact on the locality.
- Allow traffic to travel northwards on Old Ballymun Road making this road one way. If necessary make Cremore Villas one way southbound, although this may not required if southbound traffic is using St Mobhi Rd. Allowing the use of Old Ballymun Road from Glasnevin Hill has several advantages e.g. it avoids the three schools, it eliminates one right turn and a left turn and feeds traffic straight on to Ballymun Road, a more efficient flow that the current plan. I note that Map 7 in the Preferred Route document shows two lanes on Griffith Avenue; this has recently been reduced to one lane.

In the absence of modifications to the plan, the locality will endure such traffic density that the positive impact of circular and other bus routes will be minimal as they will be almost stationary in gridlock. For this household it looks like all pain with no gain.

An additional unrelated matter:

There are plans for more cycle paths beside footpaths. As residents who walk in the area daily and have to take evasive action to avoid being struck by cyclists, it would increase pedestrian safety if there was a physical barrier/divide between adjacent cycle lanes and footpaths.
