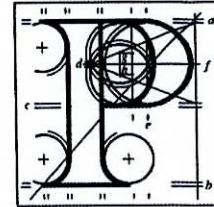

Our names are Glenda & Stephen Smullen, we live at 72 Tamarisk Avenue, Kilnamanagh, Dublin 24, D24 CH0F. (██████████)

We would like to submit an objection to the proposed NTA Bus corridor planned for the Green Spot across from the Cuckoos nest Public House on the Greenhills Road, Dublin 24.

They want to have a wider road for the Buses but the "Bottleneck" of traffic that currently exists is caused by a narrowing of the Road at the traffic lights on the Greenhills Road no where near the proposed plan for change.

We would like to object for the following reasons –

- Our Three Children attend Colaiste De Hide, a secondary school just at Tymon Park, our children must cross one main road, now they will have to cross TWO, dangerous roads.
- School children coming from other areas use this route every morning, where is the new route??
