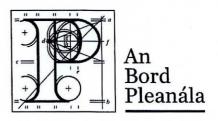

Construction Compound TC2 at Green Space on east side of the R819 Greenhills Road, junction of Bancroft Park to facilitate the Tallaght/Clondalkin Core Bus Corridor Scheme, CPO Scheme 2023.

• Bancroft Park is a 50+ year old residential area, beside Tallaght Village and populated by a large number of senior citizens and young families. The Green Open Space is maintained by South Dublin County Council and a local Tidy Towns group. Social, recreation and leisure activities take place on this Green and it is well used by younger children and older persons who take walks around the Green Space as part of their healthy living experiences. This Green Open Space is located beside the Greenhills Court apartments and across the road from a row of six houses in Bancroft. This part of Bancroft was made into a cul de sac by South Dublin County Council at the request of local residents, leaving only a pedestrian throughway, to help reduce the traffic flow of cars using the area as a rat run and help prevent speeding within the estate. The proposed Construction Compound will exacerbate the situation for these residents by introducing Heavy Mechanical Construction Equipment into this small, quite cul de sac and will increase noise levels, dust, traffic levels and will pose a risk to younger families who use the footpath there to access St Marys National School and older residents who use the pedestrian throughway to access St Marys Priory and Tallaght Village.

This Green Open Space is very well maintained by the local Tidy Towns group and other residents and adjoins a large apartment complex. In addition to the residents and families of Bancroft estate, this Green Open Space is very well used by the residents of this apartment complex, Greenhills Court, as it is the only recreational area immediately available to the residents and their families. To remove the use of this space from these families, for whatever amount of time is required for construction works and reinstatement to be completed, without offering an alternative option for recreation, wellbeing, healthy activities, and would show no consideration for the welfare of these citizens.

- There are other possible alternative sites, adjoining the Old Greenhills Road, where a leasing arrangement could be negotiated with the owners, without the need for a CPO of Green Open Space. These potential alternative sites are situated within St Marys Priory where there is a very large, much unused, car park and there is additional large open space at the adjoining TUD, again land that could possibly leased without the need for a CPO and would reduce the risk of harm to citizens of the local area by introducing heavy Mechanical Construction Machinery into a quite residential area.
- The attempt to CPO this Green Open Space is not in the best interests of the residents of Bancroft, Greenhills Court or Tallaght Village and while the majority of residents would support BusConnects, they and I believe this CPO comes at too high of a cost in terms of mental and physical wellbeing and would amount to a serious intrusion into the lives of all the residents in the area.
