

I am an old age pensioner living on my own and I need my car parked near my home, I do get the bus when I can but there are places I wish to visit that are not accessible by bus.

I wish to object to the following:

Removal of car parking spaces on Strand Street and green area. Your proposal to create 3 spaces on the current green area will destroy the only green area we have. Most homes in the area do not have gardens and depend on this area for a meeting area and to provide some colour, the local Tidy Town committee have organised flower boxes and planting to increase the availability of flowers for bees and other insects.

The disabled car space is not needed, as the lady it was put there for died some years ago. The photo figure 3.29 is an old photo and is not relevant.

Ringsend Park must not be turned into a 24-hour park with lightening, as this will increase the anti-social behaviour already there.

Alternative routes for cycle lane.

The cycle lane on Strand St could run along the present path, which would just have to be widened, and at the end of Strand St and Pembroke St the granite could be removed and that would provide for the cycle land and remove the need for the road to be narrowed. The cycle lane could also run along the other side of the granite wall and wind through the trees, this would enhance the joys of cycling.

Another alternative is to continue the cycle land on the Sean Moore Rd into Pidgeon House Rd to connect with the end of Cambridge Tce and Thorncastle St and would then join the Clonskeagh green way, which is going over the East Link or the new bridge over the Dodder.

I hope you will take my concerns on board and leave us with our parking.
