Dear Sir/Madam,

I refer to case file 321466 seeking planning i.r.o of development at a/m facility.

I along with a number of friends take a keen interest in planes and watching planes landing, take-offs and taxing at Dublin airport.

One of my friends had informed me about a small ad in the Star newspaper, something to do with the planning for a waste centre at the back of the airport

We were wondering if it was a place that had a massive fire that had billowed smoke for hours. So I followed up on the newspaper but the name of the applicant was "Saint Margarets Recycling & Transfer Centre limited"

But I could not find this company on the Fingal website and then I was informed by my friend that no such applicant exists, so I was unable to get the information on planning nor on the waste permit register of the EPA.

So I was unable to make a valid assessment of this applicant. I thought it might be in new company but when I went to the yard at the back of the airport, I could not see any notice along the road. But I asked the staff member, I assumed he was a staff.

He said I needed glasses it was on the wall to one side. I looked at this notice that was not really publicly displayed nor in an open position. So the applicant was "Saint Margaret Recycling and Transfer Centre limited. So it was not misprint, it was the same name applicant in the newspaper and then Paul my friend told me it was the same applicant on the ABP application form.

Could not find Saint Margarets Recycling & Transfer Centre limited on the Fingal website in planning so this must be a new company as all three documents said the same applicant so it's very strange.

So it must not be correct and we are unable to carry out an informed inquiry as nothing matches. So I believe the application is invalid as it is not a real company.

So I'd like to object to this application on misinformation provided as it does obstruct our rights to get correct information. I would like to get my money back if that was possible when the application is declared invalid as this limited company does not exist at the time of application.

Is this some kind of method to get planning by default for using a fake name to throw decent people off the scent. All the notices should be declared invalid.
