We greatly appreciate your advice that you will endeavour to ensure that the schedule is finalised quickly.

We just wanted to update you on 2 associated matters now arising that you may wish to consider:

- 1. We acknowledge that since our previous correspondence to you on 18 March 2021, the Irish timeline has shifted forward by approximately 1 month from the dates that were set out in the schedule that we issued to you.
