## **Re: Celtic Interconnector - Concept for Public Participation**

On behalf of the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht, I refer to correspondence received in connection with the above.

Outlined below are heritage-related observations/recommendations of the Department under the stated heading(s).

## Nature Conservation

The National Parks & Wildlife Service (NPWS) of the Department of Culture, Heritage and the Gaeltacht welcomes the participation concept, and look forward to engaging with Eirgrid in Step 4 of the process in autumn 2019.

Amongst the conservation issues that the NPWS wish to discuss are to the exact route and nature of the development option within Ballyvergan Marsh proposed Natural Heritage Area (pNHA 078), near Youghal in County Cork, the surveys required for otters and kingfishers in relation to cable river crossing works, and the potential for electro-magnetic interference with migrating and dispersing fish, elasmobranchs and lamprey. Any adverse effects on the integrity of the pNHA must be avoided.

The attention of the applicant is drawn to the more detailed previous responses by the Department to earlier consultations, and to relevant advice on the NPWS website at <a href="https://www.npws.ie/development-consultations">https://www.npws.ie/development-consultations</a>.
