

Introduction

We, RMLA, are acting for our Client, Tesco Ireland Limited, Gresham House, Marine Road, Dún Laoghaire, County Dublin to prepare this submission in response to the submission, dated 26th October 2022 and 22nd March 2023, received from the National Transport Authority (hereafter 'NTA') on the abovementioned scheme.

Please note that going forward all correspondence in relation to this submission should be sent to the Agents, RMLA, Unit 3B, Santry Avenue Industrial Estate, Santry Avenue, Santry, Dublin 9, D09 PH04. We request that An Bord Pleanála (hereafter 'ABP') keep us informed of any updates relating to this application.

The retail sector makes a major contribution to Dublin City and suburbs, by increasing the vitality and viability of its urban settlements and villages, and acts as an economic anchor, creating significant employment and indirect economic and social activity. In this regard, our client welcomes this opportunity to further engage with the NTA and ABP in respect of the preparation of the BusConnects Scheme.

Thomas Street

As highlighted in our client's previous submission, Tesco operate a store at 51-52 Thomas Street and the existing loading bay outside of the premises is to be removed with an alternative loading bay proposed; however, it is approximately 120m from the store to the west. In response to the above, the NTA have stated:

"a relocated loading bay is proposed approximately 120m west of Meath Street. The Road Safety Audits undertaken for the Proposed Scheme, included as Appendix M of the Preliminary Design Report provided in the Supplementary Information, do not highlight any safety issues with the proposed arrangement in this regard."

We appreciate the NTA's response and the fact that the Road Safety Audit did not highlight any safety issues; however, our client's concerns are in regard to the health and safety of <u>pedestrians</u> and the

occupational health and safety of our delivery/handling staff. Thomas Street is a busy thoroughfare and the proposal of a loading bay c.120m away is of a significant concern to our client.

The current proposal would result in a significant cage pull/push on a narrow busy public street and the need to cross over the Meath Street junction, navigate level changes with a heavy load while maintaining clear visibility of the footpath and pedestrians. The location of loading bays at a considerable distance from our store and many other commercial premises who are reliant on regular deliveries, typically receiving one- two per day, can lead to significant pedestrian safety issues whereby delivery vehicles/handlers come into conflict with pedestrians potentially leading to serious health and safety risks. Additionally, such a considerable distance will result in further obstacles such as on street planting, outdoor seating and cycle parking etc, resulting in further safety concerns for the public.




Figure 1: Proposed Loading Bay Cross Section with Chamfered Kerbs

Furthermore, our client had previously highlighted their concerns regarding cyclist and staff safety due to the location of the cycle lane on the inside of the loading bay. In response to same the NTA has highlighted that the proposal has been identified as the safest arrangement for cyclists in these areas as it affords the most physical protection from passing traffic. Additionally, the NTA in their response have referred to a cross section of the proposed loading bays (see Figure 1) which details a 750mm buffer zone will be provided. Our client welcomes the above clarification on same and would request buffer zones should be a maximum, wherever possible e.g., to accommodate cages that are 846mm.

Conclusion

Tesco fully acknowledges and welcomes the need to improve the accessibility of our city in line with our European counterparts. In this regard, the NTA's investment in sustainable transport to improve the urban environment of Dublin City and its suburbs is welcomed. Our client welcomes the NTA's response; however, we would request, as part of the overall BusConnects scheme, that the importance of pedestrian safety is not overlooked and the significant safety impacts that may result in the location of loading bays at a considerable distance from commercial premises.

We trust that the points raised in this submission will be considered by An Bord Pleanála as part of the assessment of this application. We are available for discussion on any of the matters referred to above and would also appreciate if you could confirm receipt of this submission by return.
