

Hi,

I'm writing in response to your letter dated 13th of june 2024 (Busconnects Bray to City Centre) to express my disappointment with the board's refusal to have an oral hearing as I believe this would convey the justified fears and concerns that the people in Shankill have with the current proposals.

Regarding the boards latest proposals, I would like to make the following observations:

1) The proposed removal of the roundabout at St.Annes Church would drastically impact approx 3500 households incl over 700 in Corbawn Estate. Any person travelling to Shankill village by car wishing to return would be left without a sensible mechanism to do so other than to perform a uturn in the main street of the village itself which would at scale undo all of the efforts being proposed by the Busconnects team.

2) The introduction of traffic lights and a one way system at Corbawn lane would force all traffic into Corbawn, Clanmar, Eaton Brae, Seaview, Beechfield Manor etc and likely cause problems of access for Fire, Ambulance and Emergency Services. The Board needs to be aware of the large number of elderly living in Beechfield Manor. Also, the large Garda located nearby.

3) The proposal to limit access at Corbawn Lane when attempted previously by the council failed completely and led to massive tailbacks leading to restoration of the current layout.

4) The assumptions regarding the benefit of a new cycle path across the entrance of Corbawn Lane to facilitate children cycling to schools on Stonebridge Road are erronious as all of the estates connecting to Corbawn Lane and Shanganagh Road are outside the catchment area of the largest school (St Annes) there and only a handful of children attend Rathmichael School.

5) The Board will be aware of many other negative environmental impacts with the destruction of more than 400 mature trees, at a time of climate crisis.

6) I understand that there is now a proposal to add a bus corridor on the N11 from Wilford Bray roundabout to Loughlinstown roundabout.

This is likely to create a time saving of a least six minutes which of itself raises the obvious question of the need for another bus corridor through Shankill.

I would urge the board to consider the points I've raised which reflect the concerns of a large number of residents in the area.
