

To whom it concerns,

We, Louise O'Reilly & Darran McGuinness (29 Patrician Villas, Stillorgan, A94 PT78), and Karleen Smyth (37A Patrician Villas), wish to register our firm objection to NTA Bus Connects proposed changes to our residential community, Patrician Villas.

We are increasingly concerned by the NTA's plans and almost incredulous of its counter arguments to ours and our neighbours' previous objections submitted in October 2023.

The NTA's reasoning for removing precious mature trees, and building out a bicycle ramp and stairwell right into our vital yet already small green space isn't plausible. The plans present huge potential for dangerous accidents as bicycles may descend at speed into the area our kids play, from the proposed new Toucan crossing, to name but one concern.

The destruction and loss of trees is despicable in 2024 with all that we have learned, and the loss of green space, and the recreational area of our community comprising long-term residents in elderly people, matched with very young children, is vast.

While it's argued to be for the greater long-term good, i.e. of traffic minisation, the cost born by our community in the medium and long term is yet even greater, and too much for justification. It's a heavy burden of future lack that we would suffer towards this objective.

It's not right to take down the trees and cut into our small green area in such a densely populated area now where Patrician Villas neighbours the N11 and adjacent a huge number of new dwellings in the multiple apartment blocks erected these past two years and still more to come.

We ask that you deny the NTA's proposals and select a less damaging and harmful (to the environment and to our community) route to minimising traffic and use of bicycles and buses as alternatives. While we support the mission, we can't support the ill-conceived tactics and location.
