

Dear Sir or Madam,

I write once again to object to the Bus Connects Bray to City Centre Corridor.

As per previous correspondence, I would like to put on record the following objections:

1. **Negative impact on Shankill Village**, Community and Landscape. In particular, I am very **concerned about the loss of a large number of mature trees** and of green areas in both north and south Shankill with a hugely negative impact on Shankill Village, the local landscape, environment, air quality and wild life. A number of these mature trees should be protected already, e.g. by previous planning decisions. Furthermore, it is not possible to plant new trees along the proposed route in Shankill. Therefore, this would have a negative impact on air quality and general health, including our children's health.

2. **Traffic Congestion in Shankill Estates, especially the Corbawn Estate**. There are changes proposed by the NTA which reflect a worrying lack of understanding of the local infrastructure. This includes, e.g., the proposed closure of one of our main roads, Corbawn Lane, with conversion into a cul de sac or one-way road. In very close proximity are, e.g., a large shopping centre, nursing home, Garda station, the beach, cliffs and coastline and daycare facilities for children. Corbawn Lane provides primary access to these as well as to some of the largest estates in Shankill. The only remaining point of access to all of these would then be a small road, Beechfield Manor. This would not only lead to choking of the local traffic in these estates, but also health and safety concerns due to restricted access for the various emergency services. Therefore, I am deeply concerned about the suggested closing off of the key access road, Corbawn Lane, and also of the destruction of the beautiful roundabout at the St Anne's

Church. As a local resident, I am very concerned about the risk of traffic jam through the village and in closed up estates, especially Corbawn. Pollution from cars and buses is emitted directly into the air and atmosphere. This poses severe health risks at every stage of our life, including premature death, but also impacts on climate change. I hereby **object to the suggested and entirely unnecessary closure of Corbawn Lane.**

3. Consideration should be given to an alternative route along the M11, e.g. for some buses, to preserve Shankill village.

3. Given the complexity of this matter, I am also requesting, firstly, an **extension to the** closing date for replies and, secondly, an oral hearing to discuss the proposed NTA road development application with the local community in Shankill.
