

Response to June 2024 update on Bray to Dublin City Centre Bus Connects Corridor (Loughlinstown Roundabout to Wilford Roundabout)

Concerns:

- 1. Reduced access to Corbawn Lane and adverse impact on residents.
- 2. Removal of roundabouts (and scenic and bio-diverse planting) with replacement of signalled traffic priority for buses. This will have an adverse impact on the environs.
- 3. No consideration of bus lay-bys. Response provided refers to difficultly of buses pulling back out onto roads. Where this has been implemented across the borough, this decision has adversely impacted traffic congestion, e.g. Stillorgan Village where previously buses used a lay-by but now stop on the main road.
- 4. Removal of mature trees and granite walls. Response provided refers to replanting 'as space would allow'. This does not provide any assurance that the mature setting of Shankill will be retained, especially given the recent removal of trees, hedgerows and granite walls as part of developments within the area.
- 5. Unnecessary cost for minimal impact on journey times. Response provided regarding assessment carried out noted.

I have always used public transport and can state with confidence that the recent increase in bus journey times to and from town are due to the additional traffic lights on the N11, particularly at Cabinteely and Donnybrook, together with the change in signalling between Whites Cross and Stillorgan. Increased development along the N11 have also contributed to increased journey times, i.e. passengers are now using several bus-stops that historically were used very infrequently used, e.g. between Loughlinstown roundabout and Cabinteely.
