Further to our previous submission on 30/9/2022, and in response to your letter of 26th August 2025, we wish to again record our continued support for this project.

Tarbert oil burning power station opened in 1969 and this saw a huge increase in local employment which lasted for fifty years – but finally closed in 2023. Tarbert is in a very strategic position with regard to the electricity grid, with underwater access to the 400 KV lines at Moneypoint.

We welcome the work going on at the moment with SSE starting construction of a new 300 MW plant to be run on sustainable biofuels.

The proposed development by Shannon LNG comprises new 600 MW of power, a 120 MW battery installation and an LNG import facility using an FSRU on the Shannon Estuary, which is the perfect site owing to the very deep waters at the site, and a very large land bank which will also facilitate other industry coming to this area.

We strongly urge An Coimisiun Pleanala to sanction this development which has had the full support of the local people for 15 years or so.
