



As a resident of Palmerstown Village I would like to submit the following observations,

1. Cycle Path - Cyclists Safety.

I welcome the proposal and I consider it to be an excellent initiative although I must express real concerns that the route is planned to cross the main 148 and Upr / Lr. Kennelsfort rd. junction. This is a major junction where several incidents over the years have occurred. It is commonplace to see drivers breaking the traffic lights at speed. May I suggest an alternative solution to be considered e.g. an elevated cycle route similar to the existing pedestrian bridge. This will separate cyclists from the traffic.

Child Safety - Toucan Pedestrian Crossings.

Both the 148 / Oval and 148 / Kennelsfort Junctions are major crossings on the 148. The breaking of traffic lights on the stretch of the road is commonplace. Pedestrians safety at the 148 / Kennelsfort junction is guarded by the provision of a foot bridge. The 148 / Oval junction is not. Given the number of children living on the northside of the 148 and within Palmerstown Village that access the schools on the south side of the 148 may I suggest that a footbridge be provided which will separate the children from the traffic.

3. Amended car parking arrangements

The parking plan for the Palmerstown Village will increase car parking facilities in the Village considerably along the southside of the Old Lucan Road in front of Red Cow and Wood Farm Cottages. Currently there are nine spaces but the new layout suggests that this will increase to twentynine, not withstanding the fact the parking along the Stewards Hospital wall will be eliminated to facilitate the cyclepath. The added advantage of this plan is that the continuous parking of trucks, buses, and other heavy vehicles in this space will be illuminated also but I do caution that rigorous policing by parking wardens will be required.

4. Proposed Bus route through Palmerstown Village,

Currently there are two bus stops, no's 2241 and 2242 on the east-bound carriageway of the 148 and two, no's 7293 and 4401 on the west-bound carriageway between the Oval and Lr. Kennelsfort Rd.junctions. The following are the number of buses that stop at each,

2241 = 18

2242 = 18

7293 = 10

4401 = 11

This allows for a great choice of buses for commuters as the different bus numbers share elements of the same routes. If commuters choose to use the No. 26 route (later to become the no 80 bus route) when it is rerouted through the village this limits their choice to one bus route. Also, it's worth noting that when the 26 buses arrive at stops no. 2241 / 2242 currently, heading east to the city, in most cases they are are full. For those commuters travelling on the no.26 bus route, as a consequence of having to transit through Palmerstown village this will result in delays as the bus will have to negotiate two sets of traffic lights at two extremely busy junctions i.e. the Lr. Kennelsfort rd. and 148 junction and also at the 148 and Palmerstown Village east junction. In particular when the bus is exiting at the Palmerstown and 148 junction on an east-bound

Journey to the city, I envisage significant delays as it is proposed that this junction will service all vehicular traffic exiting the village heading east. The completion of the residential development of 279 apartments at the junction of Lr. Kennelsfort Rd and 148 Junctions will substantially increase the traffic volumes through the village.

 Village Residents – Access/ Egress to and from the rear of Red Cow Cottages and Wood Farm Cottages.

Please see attached a CD with a file of me accessing / egressing with my caravan from the common access point which serves both Red Cow Cottages and Wood Farm Cottages. on old Lucan Road. My apologies for its orientation. Note that other residents have caravans and in one case a boat who use this entry / exit point. The entry / exit point is also used by residents for vehicular access. The proposed narrowing of the Old Lucan Road to allow for the installation of bus stops at this point will cause delays to traffic due to residents using the Red Cow and Wood Farm entry / exit point. For larger vehicles such as caravans etc. the new road layout will cause these vehicles to traverse both lanes of the road introducing a real hazard to road users. I request that the proposed decision to introduce a bus route through the village be reconsidered on the basis that it provides no advantage to commuters, road users or residents.

6. Removal of the left turn to the city eastwards at junction 148 and Lr. Kennelsfort Road.

The removal of this turn for Traffic exiting Palmerstown village will cause traffic congestion within the Village as all traffic requiring to journey east will be forced to exit the village at the Old Lucan Rd east and the 148 road junction. I request that this decision be changed and the turn be maintained.
