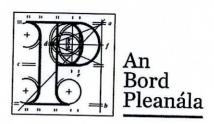

Observation on case number 316272

Hello

My name is Gavin Maguire and I live at 66 Greenlea Road with my wife and adult children. We are all cyclists as well as motorists but choose cycling or public transport wherever possible. I am therefore a supporter of bus connects.

The consequence of the bus gate for Templeogue Road will redirect huge volumes of traffic down Fortfield road and then down Greenlea Road each day. Greenlea road will be turned from a quiet residential road into a busy main road with most of the 7500 cars that currently use the Templeogue road diverting down Greenlea Road. In this planning application the NTA has proposed to ban all traffic from turning right onto Greenlea Road from Fortfield Road which a clear acknowledgment of the expected impact on Greenlea Road.

It is critically important for Greenlea Road residents that this proposed right turn ban is agreed and enforced. Perhaps the entrance to Greenlea Road from Fortfield Road could be angled in such a way as to make turning right difficult or impossible which would help reinforce compliance with the no right turn.

Indeed consideration should also be given to a more effective solution that would not require any enforcement actions. I have seen a number of streets in housing states such as ours around the city where bollards have been put in at the end of the street making the street a one way street. This would be the cheapest and most effective solution. This could be done on a trial basis to assess its impact and acceptance among the local residents.
