

Re: Templeogue/Rathfarnham to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Scheme.

## A chara,

As owners of properties at Lissenfield, Lower Rathmines Road, Dublin 6 respectively, we wish to highlight our grave concerns regarding the proposed Templeogue/Rathfarnham to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Scheme, which has been submitted to An Bord Pleanála for approval. We respectfully suggest that the proposed 'bus gate' on Lower Rathmines Road be re-sited/re-located to the north of Lissenfield's entrance, ideally, to the north of Church of Mary Immaculate Refuge of Sinners (Rathmines Parish Church) and that the intended restriction on right turning vehicular movements by general traffic from their entrance onto Lower Rathmines Road, be omitted from the Bus Corridor Scheme, for the reasons and considerations set out below:

- Lissenfield is a mature cul-de-sac residential development comprising 57 homes and the entrance to Lissenfield opens directly onto Lower Rathmines Road, which is a key section of the proposed Templeogue/Rathfarnham to City Centre Core Bus Corridor Scheme between it and the junction of Lower Rathmines Road and Richmond Hill and of Rathmines Village and its environs. It is home to c.100 residents, a cross-generational community comprising young single people, couples, young families and older people. Lissenfield residents are active members of the Rathmines community and avail of a wide range of local community, social, retail, cultural and other facilities and services in Rathmines Village and locale. The proposed siting of the 'bus gate' is to the immediate south of the entrance to Lissenfield, will result in restrictions being applied to right hand turning movements of vehicular traffic from Lissenfield towards Rathmines Village. For particular members of the Lissenfield community e.g., people with mobility issues, elderly people and parents with young children etc., who are compelled to use their car to access essential medical, hospital, childcare, retail, social, banking and other essential services and their only access route to these facilities/services is via Lower Rathmines Road. Access to these services is critical to sustaining the vibrant Lissenfield community and to their quality of life. In essence, the siting of the 'bus gate' and restrctions on vehicular movements will sever Lissenfield residents' connection to Rathmines Village and its wide range of essential community, medical, social and retail facilities and services;
- The proposed restrictions on Lissenfield residents' vehicular movements i.e., travelling north from Lissenfield to turn left at the junction of Lower Rathmines Road and Grove Road at La Touche Bridge, will be the only direct vehicular access route for Lissenfield residents to Rathmines Village. This will have a serious, disruptive impact on Lissenfield residents' levels of connectivity and access to essential community, medical, childcare, banking, retail and other essential services in Rathmines Village and its environs. Moreover, it will add significantly to the time, cost, inconvenience and stress involved by having to take an unnecessarily circuitous route to avail of local services and amenities.
- Individually, we each have personal circumstances that require us to have immediate access to medical and primary care services, including being: (i) a single Mother of a 4 year old child with severe Anaphylaxis allergy, a sudden and very serious allergeric reaction, which requires the Mother's immediate access to the child's school in Milltown and Hospital A&E service; (ii) a person recovering from two Strokes; (iii) next of kin to a sibling with severe mental health problems; and (iv) a carer of an elderly Mother (84 years). These circumstances highlight the complex responsibilities of Lissenfield residents and their need for immediate and ease of access to their family members and to vital medical and primary care services. Therefore, any added anxiety and stress on Lissenfield residents as how to navigate circuitous routes to vital medical care should be avoided at all costs.

Thank you for considering our observations and we await the decision of An Bord Pleanála.
