

This submission focuses on the proposals for the 1km section of Templeogue Rd, between Terenure College and Terenure village. The proposals for that section include the following restrictions for cars travelling towards Terenure village:

- Right turn bans into Rathdown Avenue and Rathdown Park and Fergus Rd
- A bus gate (operating from 6am to 8pm, 7 days a week) at Olney Crescent/Grove ("Olney")
- A left turn ban on cars exiting Olney

Terenure village will be a pinch point as two bus corridors (from Templeogue and Rathfarnham) will converge in the village.

The proposals in question will have the effect of diverting traffic from one bus corridor (Templeogue) to the other (Rathfarnham). This submission makes a suggestion to improve the situation.

The proposals will have the effect of funnelling a significant amount of traffic to the Rathfarnham bus corridor via the junction at Rathdown Park/Rathfarnham Rd.

Cars travelling to Terenure village and beyond from the following locations will end up at that junction and on the Rathfarnham bus corridor:

In addition, while the proposals should, in theory, discourage traffic from beyond Terenure College from travelling down Templeogue Rd (towards the city), the proposed position of the bus gate at Olney means that it is likely that many cars from beyond Terenure College will continue to travel down Templeogue Rd, all the way to the bus gate at Olney, and then use Olney as a turning point to double back and then turn left into Rathdown Park. (Cars from beyond Terenure College may well also travel down Templeogue Rd and turn right into Rathdown if the right turn bans are not enforced.)

The junction at Rathdown Park/Rathfarnham Rd is already a problem. It can take a long time to get through the (short) green light when exiting from Rathdown Park. The situation will get considerably worse if a significant amount of extra traffic is funnelled there. That extra traffic is essentially being diverted away from the Templeogue bus corridor at the expense of the Rathfarnham bus corridor. In this regard it is important to note that the Rathfarnham bus corridor will share one lane with cars for a section before and after that junction - see General Arrangement Drawings 8 & 9 of 47<sup>2</sup>.

The following suggestion will have the effect of alleviating pressure at the Rathdown/Rathfarnham junction and the Rathfarnham bus corridor, without having any appreciable impact on buses on the Templeogue corridor.

Suggestion: move the bus gate from Olney further away from Terenure village. The existing bus stop at the ETB Sports Ground might be a better location for the gate. That would have the effect of reducing the number of cars at the Rathdown Park/Rathfarnham Rd junction and on the Rathfarnham bus corridor because:

- (i) it will stop cars from beyond Terenure College using Olney as a turning point and then entering Rathdown Park and
- (ii) it would allow residents between the village and the bus gate (to include Olney) who need to use their cars to travel to Terenure village and beyond (which is only a small number) to continue to go through the village via Templeogue Rd.

Secondary submission — if the bus gate location is not changed, the hours of operation (and the related left turn ban from Olney) should be limited to peak times. The proposal to operate the bus gate from 6am to 8pm, 7 days a week is excessive and disproportionate.
