


Dear Madam/Sir.

I welcome the opportunity to make my views known on the Bus Connects Swords to City Centre Scheme. I support the proposal but believe an additional measure would benefit the scheme and the local community in the lower Drumcondra area. I therefore request that you consider the following issue before you proceed further with the proposal.

Saint Anne's Road (leading to Saint Patrick's Road) in Drumcondra, Dublin 9 is a rat run for cut through traffic. In recent years this road has become noticeably busier. This is a dangerous situation as Saint Anne's Road is a quiet 30 kmph residential street that includes a small children's pocket park and is used for training by the National Council for the Blind. In 2021, the road was temporarily closed to motor traffic for a period of two weeks to facilitate road works. During this time, the volume of traffic on Saint Anne's Road and in the surrounding Iona District was noticeably reduced. There appeared to have been little or no negative consequences for residents, emergency services or waste collection services. My suggestion is that Saint Anne's Road is closed to motor traffic at the junction of Drumcondra Road while keeping permeability for pedestrians and cyclists. This would require a no right turn on Drumcondra Road southbound at the junction of St. Anne's Road which would benefit the bus connects scheme by removing a potential conflict where cars turning right need to cross over the new bus lane and cycle lane. The section in the scheme in question is covered on page 36 of Chapter 3: General Arrangements – see detail below.



The next map shows the route of the existing rat run which this closure would help to eliminate. It should also be mentioned that access to Saint Anne's Road and surrounding streets would be maintained via Whitworth Road or Iona Road.



Closure of the junction at Saint Anne's Road would also create an opportunity for public realm improvements. The pocket park could be extended, or a small plaza created with space for seating that would benefit the local cafes and coffee shops. See below some photo montages:









The closer of this junction would have widespread local support. Traffic travelling west from Conliffe Road could turn right (instead of left) onto Drumcondra Road to access Iona Road which already has traffic calming measures in place including pedestrian lights and speed ramps. Traffic travelling south could enter the Iona Area by turning right at Botanic Avenue or Hollybank Road. The previous closure of Saint Anne's Road for road works has shown that a trial of this measure was a success.

I hope this is something that can be considered for inclusion or at least piloting.
