

Bus Connects: Compulsory Purchase Order of part of green area along Swords Road adjoining Seven Oaks and Griffith Downs, Dublin 9 for a two-way cycle lane of 60 meters long between the pedestrian entrance to Seven Oaks and entrance to Griffith Downs, Dublin 9.

We, the residents of Seven Oaks wish to formally oppose the proposal to make a two-way cycle path between Seven Oaks and Griffith Downs on the basis that there are adequate cycle paths in existence at these locations which operate very well at present. There is no need to remove any of the green area along Swords Road to facilitate an unwanted double cycle lane which would serve no useful purpose. We have a single cycle lane going towards the city and a single cycle lane going out of town on the west side of Swords Rd. The current cycle lane between Seven Oaks and Griffith Downs is more than adequate for current and future cycle traffic. The traffic lights at the entrance to Seven Oaks and the Bonnington Hotel are sufficient, with slight modifications, to allow safe entrance to our estate as is the current position.

We do not wish to have any of our valuable green area removed for this purpose.

We do need an upgrade to the bus shelter and the area around it including the removal of the metal railing which is positioned outside the pedestrian entrance to Seven Oaks and which is wrongly positioned resulting in cyclists riding on the grass at this point in order to access the existing cycle path.

We urge ABP to reject the proposal to remove any of the well-maintained grass area in order to facilitate an unwanted double cycle lane along this short strip of footpath.

The current green agenda should ensure that we retain as much of the current green areas as we can for future generations. We think that we should retain all the green spaces that we have. We hope you agree with our position.
