

Dear Sir / Madam, We would like to make an observation regarding **Case Number: 317660** 

It is desirable to have a Bus Corridor into town. However, I believe the proposal to reduce vehicle access from Corrib Road / Derravaragh Road will put undue pressure on one single junction Corrib Road / Kimmage Road Lower.

The vehicle access and egress from Corrib Road / Derravaragh is a crucial option for our residents to reduce an already congested bottleneck at Corrib Road / Kimmage Road Lower.

The junction from Corrib Road / Kimmage Road Lower already sees congestion due to a number of existing factors:

- Passing Traffic that parks on both sides of Corrib Road at the junction of Corrib Road and Kimmage Road Lower to access the shops.
- Delivery Vans impede the vision of oncoming Traffic in both directions when exiting from Corrib Road onto Kimmage Road Lower.
- Refuse Collection / Delivery Vans block thoroughfare of Corrib Road and create further congestion.
- Concern regarding Fire Engine and Ambulance access / egress.
- On street parking along Corrib Road currently does not allow 2 x cars to pass freely, therefore increasing bottleneck on Corrib Road / Kimmage Road Lower junction.

With only one entrance and exit to Corrib Road, the problems and congestion listed above will multiply.

We both commute to County Wicklow, and on separate times we have got caught in this bottleneck at Corrib Road / Kimmage Road Lower. This can be due to Refuse Collection and or Delivery Trucks or simply too many cars trying to exit while cars are trying to enter Corrib Road. The cars have nowhere to go and the junction cannot facilitate movement of cars in and out of Corrib Road. To reduce

congestion at that junction, we will use Derravaragh Road, or Hazelbrook Road and we fail to see why this cannot remain accessible when required.

If the proposed limitation is enforced, 125 houses and their residents will be reduced to one single access and egress to Corrib Road which is already experiencing congestion.

Fire Engine & Ambulance will be reduced to a single access/egress point that is frequently congested. With elderly residents on Corrib Road, this is also of great concern. It creates a potential hazard.

The Corrib Road/Kimmage Road Lower junction serves school children enroute to school and teenagers who frequent the XL shop. As parents, we would be concerned about forcing additional traffic to that single junction point.

This junction does not serve vehicles or pedestrians well and increased traffic from both directions will only amplify potential hazards.

Connections to our neighbouring streets and the Village of Terenure and beyond is crucial throughout the year for residents of all ages and I ask that you maintain that connection for the safety and welfare of our residents.

It is for these reasons that I ask you to reconsider the proposal of limiting vehicle access from Corrib Road to Derravaragh Road.
