Dear Sir/Madam,

I wish to submit an objection to the Kimmage to City Centre bus corridor – specifically relating to Plot list 1002(1).1g, 1002(2).2a,1002(3).2g

My primary concerns are as follows

- No full explanation on how it affects the apartments at Mount Argus Square has been provided. For instance, it removes where the communal bins and bike storage are, with no alternatives. Also unclear how NTA will ensure this doesn't compromise security at Mount Argus Square Apartments
- Makes an already busy part of Sundrive Road even busier, with a cycle lane slowing down traffic and is within meters of the exit from Supervalu shopping centre. This seems quite dangerous beside a Montessori school and numerous other small businesses reliant on footfall. I can't think of anywhere where a cycle corridor crosses a busy intersection right beside a large shopping centre.
- Numerous safety measures were brought in over the past 15 years, at expense by residents of Mt Argus Square, due to criminality on laneway beside Gallery 23, and breaks ins via illegal access from Sundrive Road (numerous calls to Gardai at Sundrive Road over the previous ten years can back this up). This will undo all of this work. There were also issue with petty crime / groups of teenagers gathering at Stoneboat; they will now have access to this again.
- The part of the Poddle to be covered up has been a haven for various birds and animals. Ducks tend to nest here as its safer than the park. It also runs onto a mature part of the riverbank, again with lots of animals living there etc. This will be ruined by cycleway.
- As a cyclist myself, I have been cycling in that area for over 15years, and always exited Mount Argus via the main gates onto Lower Kimmage Road rather than through park to get into Dublin city and I can't see this changing. It is quicker (due to lights at end of Mount Argus Road), easier (wider road) and safer (less pedestrians / parked cars). I don't see this changing, so in essence, this will result in a rat run for cyclists to avoid lights at Sundrive Road / Lower Kimmage Road crossroads only. This makes it very unsafe, not only for cyclists, but also for residents and the school children who cut across the park. It also renders the whole project a bit pointless.

On a separate note, the proposal to remove access to five points crossroads from Kenilworth Square removes access to Harolds Cross for all residents between Rathgar and Leinster Road (as you can't turn on to Harold's Cross from Rathgar Avenue anyway). It's also nonsensical from the point of view of the blockage of Brighton Road on Terenure Road just announced by DCC. Some joined up thinking between DCC and NTA would be beneficial before so much money is spent on these plans.
