

## Dear Sir/Madam

As concerned citizens of Shankill we would like to put forward the following observations in regards to the proposed bus connects route through Shankill village.

- The proposed scheme's development lacks adequate consideration of alternative options, particularly the NII/MII route, given the planned NII/MII (Bus Corridor) Interim Scheme, the long-term NII/MII Junction 4 to Junction I4 Improvement Scheme Upgrade, and the future LUAS extension.
- The absence of proper and safe cycling infrastructure along the proposed route, especially from Loughlinstown Roundabout through Shankill village, results in the failure to achieve a stated fundamental objective of the scheme.
- The substantial opposition to the Shankill route, demonstrated throughout the entire public consultation process, underscores the necessity for the developer to reconsider alternative options.
- As indicated in the environmental assessment, only minimal time savings occur between Bray north and Loughlinstown. The assessment recognizes that the majority of time savings occur as the NII approaches the City Centre sections of the route.
- Significant environmental impact due to the quantity of trees which will be felled as consequence of this
  proposal.

In light of the minimal bus journey time savings for this section, the current proposed scheme cannot be justified due to its significant environmental consequences and its failure to meet the project's stated objectives.
