

My objection echoes my sentiments shared on Wednesday December 16th 2020.

As a resident of Eaton Wood I would be directly impacted by the introduction of traffic lights and a one way system at Corbawn Lane.

The plans only serve to increase congestion at the St. Anne's roundabout. Corbawn Lane is the primary access point for residents of Corbawn, Eaton Wood, Dorney Court, Eaton Brae and for those visiting Lidl, Costa and McCartans Pharmacy from the Dublin Road. That traffic is to be displaced onto Shanganagh Road. Shanganagh Road already struggles with congestion, particularly because of the placement of the traffic lights at Beechfield Manor. This is in spite of their being no option to right turn.

The real source of congestion in Shankill currently is on the Dublin Road approaching the roundabout at St Anne's Church. This is caused by people turning right onto Library Road and yet this is not addressed in the plans.

The bus service from Shankill is more than satisfactory and the yet the plans demand great sacrifice. The environmental impact will be significant. Planting of a small number of immature trees will in no way compensate for the loss of the mature trees which will have been felled. They are home to lots of local wildlife (ie: protected species, like the buzzard). They can take in more carbon than the immature trees which you propose to replace them with.
