



As residents of Shankill for the last 13yrs we have major concerns regarding the proposed destruction of Shankill as a result of the current Bray to Dublin bus connects route.

Shankill is a unique, historic and charming village which will be utterly destroyed by the proposed bus connects.

We strongly object on the following grounds:

- 1. Economics in our opinion it makes little or no economic sense to spend vast sums of money to gain approx. 5 to 7mins journey time. Of the expected journey time saving only 2 to 3 mins can be attributed to Shankill. Therefore, the cost/benefit analysis is in our opinion flawed. In addition it is our understanding that if the proposal is successful the number of buses travelling through Shankill will reduce thus weakening further the supposed benefits of the scheme.
- 2. Environment through a local survey it is conservatively estimated that approx. 470 mature trees will need to be felled to make way for the bus corridor and kilometers of hedgerows destroyed. Some of these trees are situated on housing estates that were granted planning permission in the last few years with the specific condition to retain said trees. Trees and hedgerows are vital not only for human health (mental, respiratory) but are also critical for maintaining the local biodiversity, specifically forage for bees, nesting for birds and housing for bats. It is our understanding that there are 3

- species of bats that depend on the current tree population for survival. We would encourage An Bord Plenala to investigate further. Additionally there are kilometres of historic picturesque stone walls and waymarkers that will be destroyed if the corridor succeeds.
- 3. Safety under the proposal the road between Crinken and Woodbook would be 17mtrs with no central reservation. We have major concerns on how children and elderly residents will safely cross the road given there are amenities on both sides of the road. The only safe option would be to have the pedestrian lights stay green for a substantial time which will slow down the progress of the bus and eliminate any potential saving in time by adding the corridor.
- 4. Viable alternatives it is our understanding that there is currently a proposal to have a bus corridor on the N/M11 between Bray and Loughlinston roundabout. Splitting the current service to have an express service on the N/M11 and the current regular non express service through Shankill village is a more sustainable, environmentally sound and cost effective alternative and meets the objective of all parties.
