

## **Proposed Scheme**

The Proposed Scheme has been designed to facilitate improved efficiency of the transport network through the improvement of the infrastructure for active (walking and cycling) and public transport modes making them attractive alternatives to car-based journeys.

The Proposed Scheme has an overall length of approximately 18.5km and approximately 750m of the bus corridor, between the junction with Old Connaught Ave and the Fran O'Toole Bridge is within the jurisdiction of Wicklow County Council.

#### Key Deliverables

The aim of the Proposed Scheme is to provide improved walking, cycling and bus infrastructure on this key access corridor in the Dublin region, which will enable and deliver efficient, safe, and integrated sustainable transport movement along the corridor. The Proposed Scheme is a key measure that delivers on commitments within the National Development Plan (2021-2030), the Transport Strategy for the Greater Dublin Area (2022-2042) the Climate Action Plan (2023) and the National Planning Framework 2040.

The proposed scheme also addresses key objectives set out in the Wicklow County Development Plan 2022-2028 and the Climate Adaptation Strategy for County Wicklow (2019).

The development and implementation of priority infrastructure on the Core Bus Network will ensure that delays are minimised, reliability is improved through peak and off-peak periods and mode shift from the private car is made more attractive.

The GDA Transport Strategy 2022-2042 states that key elements of the Cycling Network Plan for the GDA will be delivered as part of the Core Bus Corridor schemes.

As part of the BusConnects revised bus network proposals, the Proposed Scheme will serve the E Spine bus services.

The proposed scheme will significantly improve bus and cycle infrastructure on a very congested section of the Dublin to Bray access corridor. Most of this section will include a bus lane, general traffic lane and segregated cycle track in each direction.

### Observations/Comments

- Roads will need to be widened through residential and business areas and there will be a need to reduce the amount of on-street parking and loading facilities to accommodate the new layout. Concerns have been raised throughout the various consultation phases regarding the potential impact on Castle Street and submissions to the public consultations are summarized as follows;
  - Potential negative effects on local business in Bray due to removal of off-street parking to facilitate road widening.

In response the following undertaking has been given.

Where there is a loss of on-street parking and loading facilities we will seek to provide, where feasible, alternative arrangements close by for residents and businesses.

Further efforts should be made to minimize the loss of parking spaces and engage further with affected businesses to identify alternative parking where possible.

- Wicklow County Council are presently developing a Bus Priority scheme on the Upper Dargle Road. This scheme is key to the provision of public transport options for the future development of the Fassaroe area of Bray. The Bus Connects design should consider the provision of Bus Priority at Sunnybank Junction.
- From Wilford Roundabout the Proposed Scheme will run south along the Dublin Road and Castle Street to the end of the Proposed Scheme, just north of Fran O'Toole Bridge. This section will include the upgrade of the Wilford Roundabout to a signalised junction. The impact of the changes at the Wilford roundabout on traffic flows in Bray need to be fully understood given the present levels of congestion affecting not only cars but also public transport services in the town centre.
- The core bus corridor scheme ends abruptly at the Fran O Toole bridge in Bray, while the proposed E spine services continue through the town centre to the bus depot at Ballywaltram. Consideration should be given to the extension of the core corridor through the town centre when planning for the E spine services.
