

This office would like to make the following observations:

If any new culverts or bridges (or modifications to any existing culverts or bridges) are required to cross watercourses as part of the development or on proposed or existing access roads to serve or access the development, you should be aware that these require consent from the Commissioners of Public Works. This is a requirement of Section 50 of the Arterial Drainage Act of 1945 as amended. No local authority, no railway company, canal company or other similar body, and no industrial concern shall construct any new bridge or alter, reconstruct, or restore any existing bridge over any watercourse without the consent of the Commissioners or otherwise than in accordance with plans previously approved of by the Commissioners.

The OPW is responsible for the implementation of the regulations in the Arterial Drainage Act, 1945, including Section 50. The information brochure / application form, and useful guidelines for bridge design is available at;

Access is required by this office to the River Boyne for maintenance purposes, so we would request that a 10m strip undeveloped next to the river is allowed. This strip should be accessible to mechanical plant and should not be landscaped, paved or otherwise developed in a manner that would
