

I am in receipt of urgent representations from residents in the effected estate of Woodhaven, Merlin Park, Galway City.

These residents engaged in the whole planning and consultation process as best they could from the beginning, with enormous effort and with the sole purpose of highlighting accessibility and safety concerns amongst other issues.

Unfortunately, however they are of the opinion that these concerns were never addressed in any meaningful manner.

Given this situation, I visited the estate to make myself familiar with the situation on the ground and I also read as much of the relevant documentation as possible together with the residents' submission.

From my observations on the day and the inevitable consequences of the proposals for the estate, I have no hesitation in confirming that I share the residents' concerns.
