I refer to correspondence received in connection with the above. Outlined below are heritage-related observations/recommendations co-ordinated by the Development Applications Unit under the stated headings.

## **Nature Conservation**

These observations are intended to assist you in relation to identifying potential impacts on European sites, other nature conservation sites, and biodiversity and environmental protection in general, in the context of the current proposal. The observations here are not exhaustive, and are made without prejudice to any recommendation that may be made by this Department in the future.

The site is located within an Annex I - Dry grasslands & scrubland facies NPWS data set (2020), a Qualifying Interest for the Inisheer SAC 001275. Surveys were carried out to inform the original planning application.

The Department notes surveys carried out in 2014 (to inform the NIS) during the optimal survey period (August) found no evidence of the Annex I Dry grasslands & scrubland facies habitat on site (followed by two further surveys in April and June).

The current rNIS (remedial Natura Impact Statement) provided by MKO states: "A multidisciplinary walkover survey was conducted on the 21/11/2019 in line with NRA (2009) guidelines (Ecological Surveying Techniques for Protected Flora and Fauna during the Planning of National Road Schemes) by Olivia O' Gorman (BSc., MSc.). The ecological survey was undertaken within the optimal time of year to undertake a habitat and flora survey (Smith et. al 2011)." The Department highlights November is not optimal timing to carry out habitat surveys according to this guidance.

However, the Department agrees with the findings in the rNIS "No habitats of ecological significance were recorded within the site boundary" (the site is highly modified), and "the minor alterations to design and structural components have not and will not result in any direct or indirect adverse effects on any European site".

The Department takes this opportunity to remind An Bord Pleanála of their obligations under Article 6 of the Habitats Directive (92/43/EEC). Competent national authorities, are to authorise activity only if they have made certain that it will not adversely affect the integrity of a European site and, consequently, not likely to give rise to deterioration or significant disturbances within the meaning of Article 6(2).
