The windturbines which have been installed at Cleanrath have changed the nature of the night sky around the townland of Silvergrove where I live. The very bright red lights which can be seen from a great distance destroy what was once pretty much a 'dark sky' area where we have no street lights and very few domestic lights. I feel that this large area of unnatural light must impinge on wildlife as well as on us humans.

While the turbines are not at present working normally, they have on occasion been turned on and produce a very noticable high pitched sound which even penetrates my double glazed windows, so I am dreading what life will be like when they are turned on constantly.

I also fear for the wellbeing of the considerable number of birds and animals in the area, including a very great number of bats.
