(1) Please send the following to ABP as the submission from the Planning Authority of Cork City Council

The Planning Authority respectfully requests that the Board uphold the declaration of Cork City Council and in addition to the planning report dated 15/02/2020, we wish to add the following comments:

- Correspondence from the Environment Section clearly shows that there has been no activity at this site for a considerable number of years – Ref; Email from Sarah Molloy, dated 10/02/2020.
- Unit 3 T.P 04/28034, planning permission was granted on the 31/03/2004. Condition 8 of T.P 04/28034 levied contributions of €6,964.77. These contributions were not paid. A Site/Compliance Contribution Planning Inspection was undertaken by the Planning Authority of Unit 3 on the 24th August, 2010 for file TP 04/28034 (in use then as (G&K Community Training Centre).

The Company Register showed that Blarney Wheel A Bins Ltd had dissolved in 2006.

Given that the premises for file TP 04/28034 was no longer in use and the applicant was insolvent, a decision was taken on 26/08/2010 not to pursue levies.

Units 1&2, planning permission for T.P 04/28849 expired on the 3rd Jan, 2010. Financial development contributions were levied on Condition No 7 (€9,330.00). These contributions were not paid.

A site/ Compliance Contribution Planning Inspection undertaken by the Planning Authority on the 25/08/2008 showed that there appeared to be no remaining traces of Blarney Wheela-Bins except the site itself and portions of burned warehouses. Empty containers were being stored at this site at this time.

On the 22nd July, 2010, another site/ Compliance Contribution Planning Inspection undertaken by the Planning Authority, and it is indicated in this report that the neighbouring operator was using the warehouse occasionally but was not in ownership of it.

The use was considered discontinued by the Planning Authority and no contributions were levied.

The Site/Compliance Contribution Inspection reports are available for viewing.

 The Planning Authority would also like to bring to the Boards attention the Waste Facility Permit application which was made to Cork City Council on the 04th November, 2019.

I had a look through the Churchfield file looking at all their waste facility permits and site inspection reports.

Their first permit 02/08 (register no. 932) was issued 19th December 2008 and valid until 31st October 2011. The tonnage limit of this permit was 7,500 tonnes per annum. Based on the site inspection reports, skips were stored on site but waste was not accepted on the site until approximately November 2009. Following this, the waste process on site was shredding and packaging of cardboard.

During a site inspection on 10th September 2010, it was noted that all waste entering the site came through Ashgrove Recycling.

In 2011, the processing of cardboard was due cease on site following inspection in March and the permit was due to be surrendered to allow for a new permit for processing scrap metal. This new permit (permit number WFP-CC-04/2011 was issued on 6th October 2011 and valid until 31st October 2016 with tonnage limit of 25,000 tonnes. There were 2 minor amendments made to the permit due to a typo and the addition of accepting construction and demolition waste, resulting in the permit number changing to WFP-CC-04-2011-b in 2012.

In 2014, during an inspection on 18th November, it was noted that waste was not being accepted on site. However, storage of skips and equipment continued on site.

In 2016, waste was still not accepted on site and the permit was renewed. The new permit (WFP-CC-03/2016) was issued 19th October 2016 and had a tonnage limit of 25,000 tonnes.

No waste was accepted on site under this permit.

In July 2019, that permit was surrendered and the site was cleaned and emptied.
