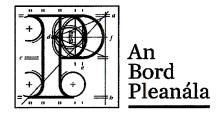

Their father, a local resident, enters to cut the grass and facilitate unauthorised use. The Guards have asked them to refrain from entering and they continue to do so to include cutting an address route out of the fence and installing football nets.

The Council served a Derelict Site Notice on Prospect House on 4th December 2024 as per the copy attached, despite the fact the new owner was being very active in seeking to develop it and planning application.

 - a) Safety of the derelict building, Prospect House, pending repair and construction works;

SCHEDULE

SECTION 156 PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT (As Amended)

- 156 (1) A person who is guilty of an offence under sections 58(4), offences. 63, 151, 154, 205, 230(3), 239 and 247 shall be
 - (a)on conviction on indictment, to a fine not exceeding €12,697,380 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years, or to both. or
 - (b)on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding €5,000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months, or to both.
 - (2) Where a person is convicted of an offence referred to in subsection (1) and there is a continuation by him or her of the offence after his or her conviction, he or she shall be guilty of a further offence on every day on which the contravention continues and for each such offence shall be liable—
 - (a) on conviction on indictment, to a fine not exceeding €12,700 for each day on which the offence is so continued, or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 years, or to both, provided that if a person is convicted in the same proceedings of 2 or more such further offences the aggregate term of imprisonment to which he or she shall be liable shall not exceed 2 years, or
 - (b) on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding €1,500 for each day on which the offence is so continued or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months, or to both, provided that if a person is convicted in the same proceedings of 2 or more such further offences the aggregate term of imprisonment to which he or she shall be liable shall not exceed 6 months.
 - (3) Where a person is convicted of an offence referred to in subsection (1) involving the construction of an unauthorised structure, the minimum fine shall be
 - (a) on conviction on indictment, the estimated cost of the construction of the structure or €12,700 whichever is less, or
 - (b) on summary conviction, the estimated cost of the construction of the structure or €2,500, whichever is less,

except where the person convicted can show to the court's satisfaction that he or she does not have the necessary financial means to pay the minimum fine.

- (4) Any person who is guilty of an offence under this Act other than an offence referred to in subsection (1) (or a further offence under subsection (2)) shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a fine not exceeding €5,000 or, at the discretion of the court, to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or to both.
- (5) If the contravention in respect of which a person is convicted under section 46(11), 208(2)(b) or 252(9) is continued after the conviction, that person shall be guilty of a further offence on every day on which the contravention continues and for each such offence he or she shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding €1,500.
- (6) In a prosecution for an offence under sections 151 and 154 it shall not be necessary for the prosecution to show, and it shall be assumed until the contrary is shown by the defendant, that the subject matter of the prosecution was development and was not exempted development.
- (7) Where an enforcement notice has been served under section 154, it shall be a defence to a prosecution under section 151 or 154 if the defendant proves that he or she took all reasonable steps to secure compliance with the enforcement notice.
- (8) Where a person convicted of an offence under section 154, the Court in addition to imposing a penalty referred to in subsection (1) or (2) as the case may be, may order the person convicted to take all or any steps specified in the relevant enforcement notice within such period as the Court considers appropriate.

We refer to your Warning Notice issued in relation to the above property by way of letter of 6th January 2025 received 8th January 2025 addressed to our client.

We attach a copy of our letter to the Council of 3rd January 2025.

You will note the position is that the Council unlawfully erected the majority of the fencing around the property, purporting to allocate a green area for a football pitch for the use of nearby properties, which actions were unlawful and made the property uninsurable due to public liability risk.

In addition to that, the Counsel have created the expectation by the three or four adjoining houses which use it and no doubt this has resulted in the complaint to Louth County Council. Perhaps the Council should consider that the fault lies with themselves. Our client is required to make the site safe and they have been forced to erect and move the fencing installed by the Council due to the Council's behaviour in exposing the green area.

Also, knotweed is in the area and our client is required to fence the entire site and keep it safe.

In addition to that, the Council have created a problem with the planning process with the planner having an expectation and anticipation that this area will be allocated for a green area.

In addition to that, the fencing is not strictly within the curtilage of Prospect House as this house in a previous deed was freestanding on its own without this portion.

The erection of fencing does not require planning permission. It is not within the curtilage of the protected structure as the structure is completely separate and independent and separated by a separate fence.

We also attach a photo marked 1 and 2 of Mullach Allain which shows the existing wire fencing which fenced off this entire area. <u>The Council illegally removed</u> this in and around 2020. The Council installed new high fencing at one part. The Owner has now had to refence it to make it safe due to the illegal actions and trespass of Louth County Council.

Any attempt to issue enforcement proceedings will result in a defence thereof and also a claim against the Council for their unlawful actions, firstly, the removing of existing fencing as shown in photos 1 and 2, and then, in installing new high fencing around the Prospect property without the consent of the owner of the lands and exposing the area concerned to a risk of injuries to third parties and making the property uninsurable due to public liability risks. Our client is seeking payment of damages and compensation from the Council for the cost of putting right the Council removing this fence. See invoice attached and legal costs also will need to be covered by the Council.

We act on behalf of the above named who acquired the above property with an intention to develop it.

It has come to our client's attention that Louth County Council has trespassed upon our client's lands and caused damage to the property. Louth County Council erected a perimeter fence along the rear of Prospect House and along the right hand boundary with an intention to confiscate adjoining land, being a large open, green area. We attach photographs for your information.

In addition to that, this exposed our client to the property being uninsured as the green area was then used by children in the neighbourhood who inserted football goals on this and a basketball ring. The green area in question is mucky in winter and not surfaced. The green area was consistently used by three to four houses in the row of housing at Mullach Allain, Omeath, Co. Louth.

The Council is well aware that there is within walking distance of Mullach Allain a playground at the shorefront of Omeath near the Grand Central Hotel which comprises a play park, a suitably surfaced and fenced football pitch, and a play area. This is within less than five minutes walk and is clearly more appropriate for these children to use.

The Council's actions have made the property and its perimeters uninsurable due to this.

In order to minimise the damage, our clients have moved the fencing around the perimeter of the green area, as particularly in winter the insurers have advised it would be subject to claims as the Council, by their actions, have sought to unlawfully facilitate the use of this area by adjoining owners, which will no doubt in due course result in public liability claims.

This has also caused difficulties with our client's planning in respect of the property as now the Council and the neighbours feel they have an entitlement to this green area, which of course is not the case as it was unlawfully appropriated for the last four to five years by Louth County Council.

Our clients have incurred a further cost of €3,853.22 in respect of removing the Council's fencing erected, re-erecting it around the perimeter together with additional fencing. We attach invoice in this regard and we require the Council to pay this and reimburse our client.
